

Division of Advancement Department of Government and Foundation Relations

Strategic Plan June 1, 2024 – May 31, 2026

Goal: Over the next two fiscal years, the Department will enhance relationships with a pool of foundations and government entities through cultivation and application submission. It is anticipated that 40 submissions will total approximately \$8,000,000.

Objectives:

1. Review Mercyhurst priorities, programs, and initiatives to identify resource needs.

- a. Monitor Strategic Plan and other key initiatives as identified by the president's Council and/or the senior leadership of the University.
- b. Be knowledgeable about academic and programmatic initiatives across the university.
 - Attend campus-wide meetings.
 - Meet with department chairs, faculty, and administrators to determine programmatic/research needs.

2. Create a culture of sponsored research and programs through outreach to faculty and incentivizing the pursuit of external funding.

- a. Work collaboratively with the VP's, Finance, and Departments to establish policies and procedures on how to support grant seekers.
- b. Serve as a resource to grant seekers.

3. Match grant-making agencies' interest with university priorities.

- a. Conduct research on potential funding sources.
- b. Whenever possible, contact funding source to discuss concept and proposal requirements.
- c. Schedule site visits whenever possible (particularly with foundations).
- d. Establish connections with various constituent groups to increase outreach (President, VP, Trustees).

4. Proposal Development – Transform ideas into a proposal

- a. Intent to Apply for External Funding Form (work with departments for approval).
- b. Research, write, edit, and prepare proposal narrative.
- c. Develop a budget that meets the programmatic needs of the initiative.
- d. Adhere to the proposal guidelines as dictated by the funding source.

e. Ensure proposals are in compliance with funding source requirements and University policies.

f. Secure all requested financial documents and letters of support (if required).



5. Internal Connections

A. AWARD

- Adhere to internal processes for recording grant activity and post-award administration (Finance, Advancement Services, Communications, etc.)
- Notify Project Director, Finance, Communications, and others.
- Execute contract agreement.
- Write and submit an acknowledgement letter.
- Work with Finance and Advancement Services to record your gift payment, account setup, and budget.
- Meet with PI/PD to discuss grant management.

B. STEWARDSHIP

- Work with Program Director for Mid-year and Final Performance Reports.
- Cultivate for future ask.

6. External Connections

- a. Collaborate with McAllister & Quinn to submit large select grants.
- b. Meet periodically with local community and government agencies.
- d. Monitor legislative and regulatory developments for issues that impact the University and its constituencies.
- e. Brief key legislators on university highlights once or twice annually.
- f. Maintain strong working relationships with key organizations (Commission on Independent Colleges & Universities; etc.) in the higher education community.
- g. Develop and execute strategy (in conjunction with M&Q) to access discretionary state funding.


